It revolved around how we wanted to play the game on the field and how we were to be perceived, im happy to say that we achieved this as well (Bakes won “best and most enterprising captain” and the team won “best and fairest club team” at the Cricket Wellington Norwood awards, great effort!) and it played a big part in our success.

From a captaincy point of view Bakes was outstanding and tactically looked head and shoulders above any other captains in the competition, he was ably assisted out on the field by some experienced and knowledgeable senior players.

The teams work ethic and desire to succeed as a group was inspiring and made my job as a coach so much easier, you set high standards on and off the field, and pushed the limits to become better individually and as a team. This started in the winter when we went through a progressive training programme. Trainings during the regular season were at times very repetitive; this was due to the fact of having twenty to twenty five players to manage per session. For us to move forward next season and make better use of trainings I feel we need another resource which would free me up more to actively coach during training sessions. This extra resource could be used as a net organiser, or run fielding sessions.

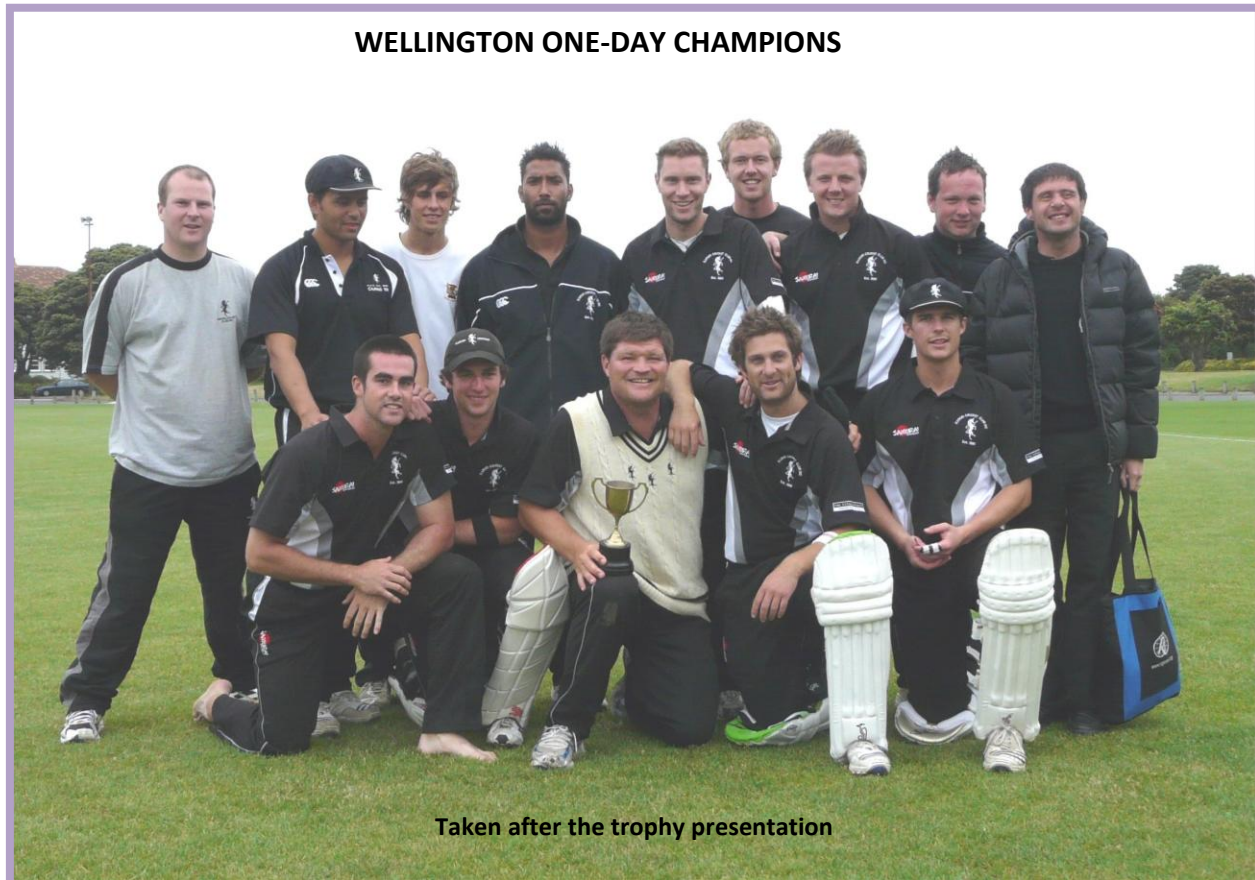

One-day review:



The first round of one-dayers had us against the highly fancied North City team which we won comprehensively and set the tone for the remaining round robin matches of how we wanted to play. A sound game plan and exceptional execution of it proved the major factor in us winning the Wellington one-day title and earning the right to represent the club and Wellington at the nationals.

To beat Easts in the final by six wickets and with more than ten overs to spare was very satisfying. In the final we bowled them out for only 113. Harry Wright, Baker, and Edwards all bowled economically with Harry and Simon picking up three wickets each, and Lee two. We chased the total with no problems, Murdoch and Ellison setting up a comfortable win before they both were dismissed.

The introduction of batting power plays was a good addition and added more strategy to our innings. We had sound systems in place about how and when the right times to use this to our





advantage was. It paid dividends more often than not, and opposing teams lacked the skills and knowledge of how to use it properly.
